Clevland ran a disappointing race.

That Whattagirl is not as reliable as her

last win indicated was quickly brought to notice when she packed up without trace in race where Appu's stronger handling of Fereneze was the feature of a tussle between Darashah's ward and Renzino who was weighed down by the extra lead. Two of the most preferred in the bunch, Whattagirl and Ravish were completely shut off the contest. purpose only to be nosed out by Key Witness who was full of running. The grey is better suited for longer distances.

The somewhat temperamental Adamile picked up the Summer Trial Stakes with a measure of comfort. Ryan Marshall rode a neat race as he grabbed the opposition by the throat. Alphabetic ran a suggestive second while Clyde Barrow covered a lot of ground to be third ahead of Soviet Park who completely faded out.

Mallesh Narredu goaded At My Command to a narrow victory over first timer Avocation who went out as a strong fancy. Shroff-ridden Avocation renewed his bid after being passed by At My Command only to go down in a photo finish. Odeon who was running a bit green finished third and is bound to put this feeler to good effect.

Flying Singer and Boss Tweed were runaway winners on a day when fancied runners ruled the roost. What followed the next day was the eclipse of favourites.
